## Human Geography, Part 2 Syllabus

### Course Description

AP Human Geography, Part 2 explores the lands and cultures of the world. Students learn about the incredible diversity of geographic regions and peoples on our planet. This is the second course in a two-part series that prepares students to take the AP Human Geography exam.

- Analyze and interpret quantitative geographic data represented in maps, tables, charts, graphs, satellite images, and infographics.
- Analyze and interpret qualitative geographic information represented in maps, images, and landscapes.
- Analyze geographic theories, approaches, concepts, processes, and models across geographic scales to explain spatial relationships.
- Apply geographical approaches and concepts to current world issues and propose a solution.

## **Module Quizzes**

At the end of each module, you will submit a short computer-graded quiz that will test your knowledge of the content for that module. These are open-book quizzes.

## **Human Geography Project**

At the end of the course, you will have the opportunity to work on a Human Geography project. You will have the option to choose a country in the world and apply the concepts you have learned in this course to assess the country. You will work on this in Modules 13 and 14.

## **Unit Tests**

There are 3 units in this Semester 2 course of AP Human Geography. Each unit will conclude with a computer-graded test.

At the end of each unit you will also have to complete a Free Response Assignment. Free Response assignments mimic the type of Free Response questions included in the AP Exam. You are expected to analyze the prompts in these assignments thoroughly and accurately.

## **Final Exam**

The Final Exam is proctored and mimics the real AP Human Geography Exam. There are a total of 63 questions, and you will have 135 minutes to complete it. There will be 60 multiple choice questions and 3 free response questions.
